

Thomas Murray recruits directors for Asia-Pacific, Americas

Thomas Murray, the investment and securities information, ratings and research vendor, has appointed two directors for the Asia Pacific and the Americas regions.

John Woodhouse, who was previously a director of the New Zealand Central Securities Depository and a chief manager of the Reserve Bank of New Zealand, becomes Asia Pacific director. He will be based in Hong Kong.

In addition, Dr Andrew Hook has been appointed as director for the Americas region and will work from Washington. Hook was most recently a member of the financial sector development department at the World Bank, with key responsibilities in a Western Hemisphere project on securities and payments.

Thomas Murray said that the two appointments would give impetus to the development of primary research into the Asian-Pacific and Americas regions' capital market infrastructure and securities markets.
